The City of Beloit community depends on the City of Beloit Fire Department to provide for preservation of life, prevention of fire, and reduction of fire loss with well trained and well equipped firefighters and paramedics. We protect the lives of nearly 37,000 residents, along with \$2.6 billion total of taxable property within the City of Beloit.

We provide fire suppression, emergency medical services, technical rescue services, water rescue response, public education programs and strong code enforcement inspection services. With a schedule of 24 hours on and 48 hours off, we answer the call at any time as a 24/7 fire department working from three fire stations.

OUR HISTORY

- 1854 — A volunteer fire department is created to serve the Beloit community
- 1886 — The beginning of the switch to paid firefighters
- 1974 — First city with a population of under 50,000 to have a paramedic program
- 2006 — The Tactical EMS program was started to support the Police Department's Tactical Unit

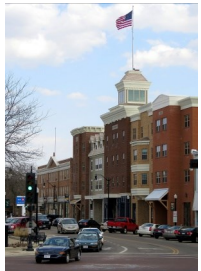
